

LCTA ANNUAL AND CAPTAINS' MEETING MINUTES 2026

The meeting was opened by the President, Andrea Weinstein, at 6:00 p.m. The following items were discussed.

3. Director of Adult Leagues Report: Nancy Pitcairn
- a. Regulation Updates and clarification
 - i. Team Default Rule
 - a. The team that receives the default does not get credit for the win (Tennislink setting)
 - b. If the team that receives the default would have been “in the hunt” with the top teams, the matches for the top teams (and all teams) against the defaulting team would be removed
 - c. If the team receiving the default does not have a chance to be one of the top teams “in the hunt” but removing all matches would change the standings for the top teams, those matches would not be removed IF they have already played them prior to the default
 - d. If removing the matches for the flight does not change anything, there is no need to remove any of the matches
 - e. These actions should be taken at the completion of the season.

b. Weather Rule – Cold/Heat Policy

- i. A heat/cold rescheduling decision shall be made no sooner than 2 hours before the designated match start time. Each team will use <https://www.weather.com> by entering the location of the match to determine what conditions are predicted at match start time. No other weather resources may be used to obtain the forecast.
- ii. The following weather conditions may subject a match to be rescheduled:
 - a. If the “real feel/feels like” temperature is 38degrees or below at the time the match is scheduled to begin play, or forecast within 2 hours of match start time.
 - b. If the “real feel/feels like” temperature (heat index) is 100 degrees or higher at the time the match is scheduled to begin play, or forecast within 2 hours of match start time.
 - c. If both captains agree, players may play one or more courts in the heat/cold.
 - d. Rescheduled make-up matches due to cold/heat must follow procedures in Regulation 2.01K(1).

iii. Makeup Match Lineups

- a. Captains are encouraged to play all individual matches at the same time, just as they would in a regularly scheduled match; however, this is not a requirement. If the individual matches are being played on different days, the line-ups will be exchanged on the day that the individual matches are being played.
- b. Team lineups on the make-up day do not have to be the same as they were on the day of the postponement even if the lineups had already been exchanged, and any defaults given during or prior to the line-up exchange are cancelled, however, any substitutions made to the lineup cannot be in the original lineup and players may not be moved within the match lineup card. *Substituting players must be on the roster at the time of line assignment and prior to the beginning of match play.*
- c. If match play has begun (i.e., at least one point played in one individual match), completed matches will stand as played, incomplete matches must be resumed by the same players at the exact set, game and point score as when play was halted. Matches that have not started do not have to be played at the same time and date but can be arranged by the individuals involved in each of the individual matches.
- d. For matches not started, substitutions may be made, however the substituting players cannot be in the original lineup and players may not be moved within the match lineup card. Substituting players must be on the roster at the time of line assignment and prior to the beginning of match play.

c. Teams to State – based on number of teams registered

- i. 2-11 teams - 1 team to State
- ii. 12-23 teams - 2 teams to State

- iii. 24+ teams - 3 teams to State
 - d. Nancy presented all of the 2025 State Champion Captains.
- 4. 2026 Facility Directors of the Year: Bill Ennis
 - a. Bill congratulated Rob Eppelsheimer & Nancy Heinz and presented them with an award.
- 5. Multiple raffle prizes were given out throughout the meeting.
